Dear Sir,

Wherein due notice under article two (2) of the Geneva Conventions First, Second, Third and Fourth has been given to you which obligates both your Government and the Government of the Hutt River Province, Principality to be bound by the conventions in all relations of their binding application.

Your attention to Article 146 of the Fourth Schedule is drawn:-

"Each High contracting Party shall take measures necessary for the suppression of all acts contrary to the provisions of the present convention other than the grave breaches defined in the following Article"

The afore is thus a duty mutually undertaken, and is in conjunction with Article 149 of the Fourth Schedule.

"At the request of a Party to the Conflict, any enquiry shall be instituted, in a manner to be decided between the interested parties, concerning any alleged violation of the Convention.

If agreement has not been reached concerning the procedure for the enquiry, the parties should agree on the choice of an umpire who will decide upon the procedure to be followed.

Once the violation has been established, the Parties to the conflict shall put an end to it and shall repress it with the least possible delay.

Wherein under the Conventions it is the obligatory duty of the occupying Power to Govern and to convene Court for the jurisdiction of the Territory.

Then a complaint is herewith officially lodged with you, and the procedures relative to Articles 146 and 149 as detailed herein are requested to be implemented and undertaken in respect to the following, which is considered to be a breach of the said conventions.

Persons of this Principality owing allegiance to the monarch of this Principality, who are citizens and or subjects thereto, and who are also, "Protected persons", who by the law of this Principality and by their conscience cannot enroll on your Commonwealth Electoral Roll. Have been and are being persecuted by prosecution which is considered to be a coercion to force a change of their allegiance and in some instances is designed to be a hinderance of their Political duties and in this and the following the ambiguity is recognized also to be offenses under the Commonwealth Criminal Code 30C(1)(b) and section 28 thereof.

The ambiguity of such may even be considered to be relative to "Genocide", which may thus be a further offense under Commonwealth law of "Genocide".

You are therefore requested firstly to suppress this violation as is the duty upon you under Article 146 of the Fourth Schedule.

Failure to do so, necessitates the fulfillment of my request for the mutual arrangement of ~~enquiry~~ as detailed under Article 149 of the Fourth Schedule.

You are requested to advise of the action you have taken to so rectify this breach of the Convention, or to commence dialogue for the arrangement of the enquiry.
